Family Service

1. Recognition

- Acetate of people from Fintry:
 - cover up with patterns and coverings progressively reveal!!
 - see who can guess who is in each of the pictures!
 - plus funny one(s) of me!!
- Was it easy or hard to recognise who was in the pictures?
 - what made it easy/hard?
 - knowing the person?
 - recognising the occasion/building, so having some idea of who might have been there?

Optical Illusions

- Let's try a different kind of recognising:
 - go through the three optical illusions, working through what is going on
- Even when things are plainly in front of us, sometimes it is hard to see clearly!!

Paul Helping People Recognise Jesus

- Background:
 - missionary journey, sent out to tell people about Jesus by home church in Antioch (learnt about that last week)
 - map of Cyprus/Asia Minor
- In the passage we'll read shortly he arrives in Pisidian Antioch, and starts to tell people about Jesus:
 - he does that by starting with things they already know are true stories from the Old Testament, stories that they recognise, reminding them of the hope God has given them that he would send a Saviour
 - they provide the backdrop, like the church in the pictures we saw earlier, making it easier to recognise the one he is introducing
 - in particular, talks about King David (David & Goliath), who was God described as a "man after my own heart"
 - then he introduces Jesus as one better, greater than King David he rose from the dead!
- Paul is hoping that they will recognise Jesus as the Saviour God promised!
 - is that who you recognise him to be?

2. Response

- Policeman OHP: moving beyond recognition to response
 - who is on the picture? (recognition)
 - what would you do if you saw a policeman doing this? (response)

Road Signs

- Put up sheet of road signs:
 - what are they? (recognition)
 - if you were driving, how should you respond as you see them? (response)
- Recognition rightly leads to response!

Response in Psidian Antioch

- So here in Psidian Antioch the people, Jews and Gentiles alike, who recognised Jesus as Saviour had a choice:
 - to reject Paul's message; to say "maybe Jesus is the Saviour... but I don't need him! I don't want him! I want to run my own life!"
 - (Jews in synagogue who were jealous of the crowds (who hadn't been there the week before....!))
 - or to respond with faith, to believe in him and accept the gift/invitation he offers (v.43, v.48!)

Consequences

- Put up "Which Path?" acetate:
 - which of A or B leads to C?: how many think A? B?
 - your choice has a consequence whether you reach the destination or not!
- Perhaps not a very good illustration, since its either a blind choice or an obvious one if you've got steady eyes!
 - the choice we have is the on-going choice of faith
 - will we follow Jesus?
 - will we admit we are helpless and ask for God's help? (for that is what trusting Jesus means!)
 - or will we, like the threatened Jews, turn against Jesus?
- Perhaps you've fully recognised Jesus as your Saviour for the first time this morning.
 - or perhaps you've never really realised that recognition on its own is not enough - recognising Jesus as Saviour demands a response!
 - will you believe today?
