

**Need**

- sweets
- party poppers
- video clip for home renovation show
- fruit
- glass water
- cold can of juice - Lilt, Pepsi...?
- (Fintry prayer video clip)

**Different angles**

- Photos of one place from different **perspectives**
  - get more of a sense of the whole; one image doesn't show you the whole picture
  - **different parts of the building, different time periods, different activities, different people...**

**Banquet (Luke 14:15-25; Revelation 19:6-9)**

- Offering plate filled with sweets!
  - contrast the normal physical messages we send out in church!
- Draping someone with party popper stuff!
  - circle, person in middle, shoot... over the top...
  - **just for fun!**
- Picture of heaven Jesus most often fixed upon was a banquet:
  - a wonderful celebratory meal, with everything that is the best
  - something to really, genuinely look forward to
- *Where do we picture ourselves at the heavenly banquet - **imagine!***
- Picture of banquet often often intertwined with picture of a **wedding banquet**:
  - with Jesus as groom... **and the church, us, as bride!**
  - we will be at the centre!

**City/home (John 14:1-2; Revelation 21:1-4)**

- *"Home on their own" clip*
- Q&A on what makes for a good home...
  - looking for things like safety, warmth, comfort, relationship...
- **Heaven described as a safe, beautiful, happy, open, holy place to live**

**Health/Tree life/River (Revelation 22:1-5)**

- *Have fruit, glass of water, cold can of something (Pepsi?)*
- **Life (image/four-fold)**
  - chat round refreshment, life, fruitfulness, health...
  - all those touched on in the descriptions of heaven
  - **are you getting the picture? Do you fancy it?**

**Jesus (John 14:3)**

- What's the best place to be? **(image)**
  - with the person you love most and who loves you most...
  - even more important than all the other nice things...
- All of this boils down to **"where Jesus is..." (image)**
  - rooted in the reality of the resurrection
  - **...that you also may be where I am. (John 14:3)**
