# (Supper and After)

### **Long Distance Relationship**

- Ever been in, or known someone in a, long-distance relationship?
  - hard work of communication, different kinds of things you get to know or not know - about each other
  - perhaps easier in the age of internet, Skype, text and other readily available modes of communication?
  - challenging! And with a high failure rate...
- So why does Jesus, who has drawn close to us in his earthly life, his close relationship with the disciples, apparently opt for a LDR?
  - "Now I am going to him who sent me" (v.5)
- Disciples clearly don't relish the prospect of increased distance:
  - Because I have said these things, you are filled with grief. (v.6)
- Because it will be better:
  - But I tell you the truth: It is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counsellor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. (v.7)
- (Maybe we recognise a glimmer of this truth in human relationships perhaps times when distance forces us into better communication, bigger picture rather than caught up in the headiness of a new relationship?)

# Having the Holy Spirit is better than having Jesus physically present!

#### The Holy Spirit will convict of sin

• You've done wrong...

### The Holy Spirit will convict of righteousness

Righteousness is what is required - only such as found in Jesus is enough
 - (and transferred to us through Jesus work on the Cross)

## The Holy Spirit will convict of judgement

- And the consequence of the gap between sin and righteousness is judgement
- This is a spiritual work, not something we can force people to
  - (lead a horse to water but can't make it drink...)

#### Conversion!

• In other words, without the Holy Spirit we could not be in full-formed relationship with Jesus, we could not be saved!

# A Relationship that Grows

- What does a growing relationship look like:
  - more honest
  - more trusting
- Truth comes from God; righteousness comes from God
  - need to be appropriated....
  - our use of the language of "learning" skews what John is talking about, and we default to head knowledge, not a whole-life shaped by...
  - this truth was "more than you can now bear" they needed to mature, to grow in the practise of following Jesus, of "abstaining from sinful desires, which war against your soul and living such good lives among the pagans..." (from 1 Peter 2:11,12)

- Hope of eternally being with Jesus (v.16)
  note the hope is relationship with Jesus, which will issue in no more tears, nice food, party atmosphere, etc
  - not that those good things will come and we'll have to put up with Jesus hanging
