Romans 4:1-8 The Example of Abraham Fintry, 16/9/2007, am

"Abraham, it's a promise"

- We've been learning over the past few weeks about:
 - how God wants to be our friends
 - but he is holy, and can't stand all the ways we've hurt other people and let him down
- But in the passage we've just read, God makes a promise to Abraham:
 - various bits to it but core is "I will be your God" (v.7)
 - ie allowing Abraham to become God's friend, his follower, and to get loads of good things as a result!
- Reliability of the promise depends on the person making the promise
- Sweets as a promise...

"Abraham, it's a gift"

- Who's ever earned any money?
 children and grown-ups...
- Christmas, birthday's, Saturday jobs...
- Could I get someone to "do a job" for me, for payment?
 - compare sweets as a gift....
 - are there maybe jobs some people couldn't do they'd never have the chance to earn any sweets?
 - sweets as gifts...
- Implications of it being a gift, how we live secure, not insecure

Conclusion

- God has promised and he is utterly reliable
- What God offers is a gift we don't have to earn it
- But a gift needs to be received
